



Architecture, Art, and Planning Policies and Procedures for Study Abroad

ELIGIBILITY

- GPA of 3.0 or higher, good academic standing, and well articulated goals for student's study abroad term
- Registered full-time student at Cornell, NOT in the final semester
- Students must take a full course load, as defined by your host institution while abroad. For a full-length term, this will translate to 15 credits upon returning to Cornell

DATES TO REMEMBER

- **APPLY EARLY!** Follow program deadlines. (allow 2-3 weeks for processing)
- Cornell Approval: *Spring: Oct 1; Fall and Full-year: March 1*

Planning Your Semester Away

- Start the process of investigation early, roughly a year before you study abroad.
- Attend CU Abroad walk-in hours and information sessions
- Review Cornell Abroad's website: cuabroad.cornell.edu. Use the "Getting Started" tab, research program options, seek advising help.

Cost, Billing and Financial Aid

- With Cornell Abroad, the cost of study abroad depends on what program you attend!
- Estimated budgets include bursared and out-of-pocket costs.
- Financial aid is available for Semester/Year programs

Credits Abroad and Transfer of Credit

- Students seeking credit for study abroad must apply through Cornell Abroad and carry a full course load equivalent to a minimum of 15 Cornell credits. All courses must be taken for a letter grade. For purposes of study abroad, enrollment in 15 US credits or the equivalent is required to maintain good academic standing.
- Short term study abroad is offered through Cornell School for Continuing Education (SCE) for Cornell credit. Transfer credit also available. Register short-term study through Cornell Abroad.



Cornell Abroad

How to make study abroad an integrated part of your Cornell-AAP experience:

Apply through Cornell Abroad to study in countries around the world. Study alongside local students in a foreign university or take specialized classes, internships or field work on programs run by Cornell Abroad, another U.S. university, or independent study abroad provider. Past students have compared urban planning in the world's major cities, conducted an independent study in Nepal, studied design in Scandinavia, worked as an intern in the British parliament, and attended some of the top schools of fine arts in Europe. Students should note that spending two semesters abroad, whether on the same or different programs, requires extra planning and, as with all study abroad, approval from the faculty advisor and Director of Undergraduate Studies for the major.

1. READY...

Consider your academic requirements, college policies, goals, and personal preferences.

Discuss your plans and set them in motion.

- Start the Cornell approval process via cuabroad.cornell.edu. Find your program and begin a "new application"
- Schedule an appointment with the appropriate advisor in your college to discuss proposed selection and degree plan.

- Complete all requirements for Cornell approval
- Prepare separate application directly with the program, if applicable.

3. GO!

Fulfill all final pre-departure requirements, and enjoy an academically stimulating and culturally enriching experience!

REQUIREMENTS

- Cornell students are required to formally study the language of the host country when in non English-Speaking countries
- Students must enroll for a full course load while abroad (equivalent to 15 credit hours) to maintain good academic standing
- Programs must last a minimum of 14 weeks for full credit
